#### Gospel: Matthew 14:13-21 - Jesus Feeds the Five Thousand

When Jesus heard what had happened, he withdrew by boat privately to a solitary place. Hearing of this, the crowds followed him on foot from the towns.14 When Jesus landed and saw a large crowd, he had compassion on them and healed their sick.

- <sup>15</sup> As evening approached, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a remote place, and it's already getting late. Send the crowds away, so they can go to the villages and buy themselves some food."
- 16 Jesus replied, "They do not need to go away. You give them something to eat."
- 17 "We have here only five loaves of bread and two fish," they answered.
- <sup>18</sup> "Bring them here to me," he said. <sup>19</sup> And he directed the people to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke the loaves. Then he gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the people. <sup>20</sup> They all ate and were satisfied, and the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces that were left over. <sup>21</sup> The number of those who ate was about five thousand men, besides women and children.

When I preached a couple of years ago at St George's, I tried to promote and to thank our Open the Book teams which regularly visit two local schools. One is Brockworth Primary Academy situated in Moorfield Road and the other one is Castle Hill Primary School situated in Abbotswood Road. I have been a member of the ecumenical team that visits Castle Hill School and when we return to story telling during the autumn term (Covid-19 rules allowing this), it will be our eleventh year of visits to that school and ten years of visits to Brockworth Primary Academy. A remarkable effort and thanks are due to all the members for continuing to serve on these teams allowing us to tell the children stories from the bible, to reflect on these stories and to join in prayer. The bible story that I preached previously was about the Greedy Farmer who rebuilt his barns to keep his grain all for himself and would not share with the poor, hungry and needy. By storing up riches for himself, he forgot all about the really important things in life, to share with others. Today I want to tell you another story about Jesus and one of his sharing miracles. This story comes from The Lion Story Telling Bible written by Bob Hartman and Krisztina Kallai Nagy. The scripture reading is from Matthew chapter 14 verses 13 – 21.

I expect when you go out for the day to the seaside or into the country that your picnic or packed lunch is similar that everyone would bring. A couple of sandwiches, packet of crisps, piece of fruit and a drink. In today's story, were are going to hear about a boy who gave up his packed lunch. It is titled The Marvellous Picnic

It wasn't long before lots of people wanted to hear Jesus talk about God. And many more wanted him to make them well. So they followed him everywhere. From town to town. From city to country. And all the way back again. We need a rest, Jesus said his friends one day. So they took a boat trip across Lake Galilee. hoping to camp for a while in the hills beyond. But people were so eager to see Jesus that they raced around the shoreline of the lake to meet him on the other side! Jesus was tired. But when he turned and saw the people following him up the hill, he stopped. They're like sheep without a shepherd, he said to his friends. They need someone to show them the

way. So he sat himself down, right there and then. And he started to teach. God loves you, Jesus said. He knows what's best for you. The most amazing things can happen when you trust him. Jesus said a lot more than that. He taught all day, in fact. And by then, the people who were listening were hungry. Philip! Jesus called to one of his friends. Can you go out and buy some food for these people? Philip just laughed. There are more than five thousand of them. It would take six months wages to feed them all. Then Andrew, Peter's brother spoke up. There's a boy here, Jesus who has a little food. Five loaves of bread and a couple of fish. It's not much, but it's a start.

So it is grinned Jesus, and he rubbed his hands together, as if he was about to go to work. Make the people sit down in little groups. Tell them we are going to have a picnic!. Jesus' friends looked at Jesus. They looked at the boys little lunch. They looked at the enormous crowd. They looked at each other and shrugged their shoulders. All right, they agreed. What ever you say. Jesus smiled as he watched them go. Then he bowed his head, thanked God for the food, and started breaking it into pieces. And, to their amazement, there was plenty for the first group, the second group and the third group and then every group! Plenty for everyone. More than enough to go round. So much, in fact, that there were twelve baskets full of leftovers to take home! The people patted their tummies. They struggled to their feet. They wiped the crumbs from their mouths. And some even burped! But all Jesus' friends could do was stare. It's just as I told you, said Jesus, God can do the most amazing things, All we have to do is trust him. Then he smiled at his helpers, popped a chunk of bread into his mouth and started off for home.

In this story, everyone had more than enough to eat, but for the next few moments we're going to close our eyes and to think about all the people in the world who don't have enough to eat.

Dear God, we know that there are lots of people in the world who need help to have enough food to eat. Please help us to be like the little boy in today's story and give what we can – even if it's only a little bit. Amen.

Holy, holy, holy is the Lord God almighty, who was, and is, and is to come. We believe in God the Father, who created all things: for by his will they were created and have their being.

We believe in God the Son, who was slain: for with his blood, he purchased us for God, from every tribe and language, from every people and nation.

We believe in God the Holy Spirit: the Spirit and the Bride say, 'Come!' Even so come, Lord Jesus! Amen.
